2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

- Power point and Audio-Visual presentations are made by faculty and students to enrich the understanding of curriculum. Workshops are organized to understand nuances of film making.
- Some departments have created Google groups/other online groups in order to share resources and enhance pedagogical engagements.
- Trips and excursions related to course work, field visits, heritage and mindfulness workshops are regularly organized in order for students to develop a real time understanding of syllabi related topics.
- Many departments organize remedial classes and have counselling sessions for students who may be in need of them. Many departments try and facilitate book banks so that under privileged students may avail those resources.
- Green Beans (Environmental Club) conducted seven weeks add-on certificate course on Environment, from August 26 - October 7, 2016, with assistance from Department of Environment, Govt. of NCT of Delhi.
- Regular lectures by eminent subject experts in their respective fields are organized by almost all the Departments for students to be aware of new departments and research trends in their discipline.
- Departments conduct student research projects. The aim and focus of this endeavor is to help the students understand the broad range of research topics and methodology.

2.8 Examination/ Evaluation Reforms initiated by the Institution (for example: Open Book Examination, Bar Coding, Double Valuation, Photocopy, Online Multiple-Choice Questions).

- As a constituent college of the University of Delhi, we follow Delhi University rules and regulations, and all norms set by them, for the end semester exam. Thereby, question papers are centrally set, and answer booklets are centrally evaluated. However, for the internal assessment process, the college has sought to make the students more involved in their own learning through internal exams, presentations and projects.
- Apart from written assignments and class tests, students are encouraged to participate and suggest ways of assessment. Through this initiative, greater emphasis on group work, discussions and presentations has emerged, while MCQs and open books tests are also facilitated.
- To further engage and empower students, peer and self-assessment is encouraged.

2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

- The peer team had appreciated the democratic and co-operative atmosphere which existed in the institution. The IQAC has worked to strengthen this spirit of co-operation and yet maintained the functional autonomy of each department.
- Hence, regular meetings with TICs, departments, and students have been held, where open, healthy debates take place, and issues relating to quality improvement are deliberated upon. Based on the knowledge acquired in these meetings, alterations and improvements in the academic and administrative processes have been attempted.
- The analysis of results has been undertaken with greater rigour and discussion with all stakeholders has been initiated in order to further improve the results. Based on feedback and discussion, changes in teaching strategies, planning and timing of curricular and extra-curricular activities have been brought about.
- The practice of inviting subject experts in their respective fields has been strengthened; lectures are organized by almost all the Departments in order for students to be aware of emerging or specialized areas and research trends in their discipline.
- Greater use of technology, by both teachers and students has been encouraged. Both audio- visual presentations and power-point presentations are being used regularly to aid in better understanding of curricular aspects.
- To enhance the understanding of film-making, practical, hands on workshops with necessary equipment have been organized to help students understand the process of film-making.
- To emphasize hands on learning and real time understanding of pedagogical issues, trips and excursions related to course work, field visits, heritage and mindfulness workshops are regularly organized for students.

5. Stuent Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services:

1. College has a long-established practice/norm of organizing open-house programme during the admission time in close association with Delhi University authorities. These are well attended by students and parents.
2. At the beginning of each semester, orientation programmes are held at three levels:
 - At the college level – in the auditorium by all the departments who provide information about GE, SEC, AECC papers.
 - At departmental level meetings held in designated rooms, departments provide further clarification and details of DSE courses. At this level, students are asked to give their choices, queries are addressed especially for 1st year students regarding DU system with regard to CBCS, marking in the exams, grading system, internal assessment, attendance rules and facilities provided by the institution are discussed in greater details and students are familiarized with the institutional support mechanisms available for them.
 - At the third level – departmental associations are formed to elect the members to the posts of President, Vice-President, General Secretary and Treasurer. The Class Representatives (CR) are appointed to assist the team. The team of students then have their general body meetings and meet the faculty members to work out academic activities they want to organize.
3. Principal interacts with CRs regularly to get inputs of departmental activities, teaching and suggestions about administrative functioning, if any.
4. College has provision for online attendance. It is available for students to monitor their progress.
5. All necessary information of students' interest from the college and university is displayed on the college website.
6. Each department has designated faculty members who provide recommendation letters to the students applying in other institutions abroad.
7. At the beginning of new academic year, Students Union elections are held on the basis of ballot election process. The Students Union gets support from the Student Union Advisors and team of Proctorial Board in the arrangement of various academic and college events.

8. Students are informed about various support and grievance redressal mechanisms available for them. They are made aware of WDC, CASH, North East Cell, Foreign

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development:

- The syllabus taught is as per the norms and regulations of UGC and University of Delhi. IQAC has encouraged more teachers to join syllabus revision committees where syllabus revision is ongoing, in order to make syllabi more meaningful for undergraduate students.
- Curricular material is prepared and updated regularly and circulated amongst students. A special effort is made to prepare and circulate study material for the Hindi medium students, who usually face a lack of quality study material.
- Academic essays, study material and e-resources are also shared with students in order to enrich classroom learning.
- Student workshops and seminars are organized to deepen the students' grasp of their subject matter.
- Question papers from previous years are discussed towards the end of the semester to ensure that the students are adequately prepared for the end semester exam.
- Subject experts in their respective fields are regularly invited to interact with students so that students are made aware of emerging or specialized areas and research trends in their discipline.
- For curricular enrichment and better student engagement, greater use of technology, by both teachers and students has been encouraged. Both audio-visual and power-point presentations are being used regularly to aid in better understanding of curricular aspects.
- To emphasize hands on learning and real time understanding of pedagogical issues, trips and excursions related to course work, field visits and heritage walks are regularly organized for students.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning:

- In the period – June 2016 to July 2017 – 16 permanent faculty members completed their PhDs and received degrees, bringing the total number to 64 out of 93 permanent members.

Innovation and Best Practices of Societies (Cultural and Co-curricular)

All the societies of the college organized their respective functions based on relevant academic, cultural, social, gender related matters and women rights among so many others. Adagio, the Choreography society performed on the theme of preservation of culture; Consumer Club strove to generate consumer rights and awareness; Entrepreneurship cell initiated denim donation drive from which cobblers made handcrafted footwear generating income; Glitz, the fashion society worked on 'fusion' designs; Lakshya (street play) concentrated on women's issues; Luminoso (Art Society) organized workshops on various art forms and continued with their art work in the open spaces of the college; Sangeetika strove to develop fusion music and Srijan honed writing skills in Hindi language. EOC worked in the internal and external spaces to make college more amenable for PWD.

7.2 Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year:

Plan of Action

- After successfully completing the first cycle of accreditation by the NAAC, as per the mandate, IQAC was formally constituted. The core committee of the IQAC in four meetings worked out the action plan for the year 2016-17 and placed the same before the other stakeholders.
- The first action plan was to strengthen both research, publication and improve upon teaching methodologies in the college. This was followed by encouraging more teaching faculty to get engaged in syllabi revision process undertaken by University of Delhi under the CBCS format.
- To improve the quality of teaching, more and more faculty members were encouraged to participate in various academic programmes/workshops/courses and to secure fellowships and grants for holding seminars/conferences/research.
- The committee that looks after the in-house college journal, *Akademos*, was asked to seek recognition by the UGC.
- Apart from the faculty, the core committee made elaborate plans to improve the academic, non-academic and cultural programmes/ activities of the college.
- Plans were made to improve the attendance of students, make teaching more interactive through wider usage of smart classrooms, increase societal networks and better results.
- The IQAC also chalked out plans for FDPs both for faculty and administration to bring out balance between both important components of the educational institution.

Action Taken Report (ATR)

The initiatives undertaken by IQAC to improve the quality of higher education in relation to the college's vision and mission statement:

- A substantial increase in number of outstation students and increase in students attendance along with vast improvement in results are clear markers of efforts and changes that have been brought out and implemented at the ground level. (**Refer 5.3, 2.1 and 2.11**).

- There has been substantial increase in the visibility of our college students in the activities of NSS (*Refer to 3.21*) and NCC (*Refer to 3.22*).
- The participation in competitive academic activities along with active engagement in non-academic as well as cultural activities has assisted our students to get wider exposure, competitive spirit and wider engagement with the outside world (*Refer to 3.25 and 3.26*).
- Efforts made by departments and societies has led to increase in social initiative programmes(*Refer to 5.12*).
- In the field of sports, awards, recognition and participation reached new heights (*Refer to 5.9.2*).
- For continued academic excellence more books and associated items were purchased by the library (*Refer to 4.3*).
- Students' achievements, wider participation and engagement is a reflection of the initiatives undertaken by the faculty to improve their teaching, and increase their research and participation in research related activities. The total number of faculty with PhD increased to 69 per cent; total presentation of papers at various forums to 48 per cent (*Refer to 2.5*); number of publications in the form of research papers to 44 per cent (*Refer to 3.4*), 25 per cent faculty wrote chapters in the books (*Refer to 3.7*) along with book publications that numbered 6.
- Deep academic involvement extended to wider participation in syllabus revision under CBCS by the college faculty (*Refer to 2.9*) and in the training programmes conducted by other institutes (*Refer to 2.13*).
- The faculty secured research funds for various projects amounting to Rs. 15 Lakhs (*Refer to 3.6*) and organization of seminars at various levels in the college (*Refer to 3.11*) and secured the approval of in-house journal *Akademios* which has now been given UGC recognition (*Refer to 3.1*).
- In one year, faculty secured significant research awards (*Refer to 3.17*) adding to the magnitude of the intensive research activities. The FDPs organized both for faculty and administration assisted in the qualitative improvement of the college both academically and administratively (*Refer to 6.3.6*).

7.3 Give two Best Practices of the institution (please see the format in the NAAC Self-study Manuals)

A) The Kamala Nehru College and JNU-Disaster Research Programme Initiative

Introduction

As part of the bigger project conferred to Jawaharlal Nehru University-Disaster Research Programme, Centre for Excellence in Disaster Management, a group of colleges from University of Delhi were selected to conduct Disaster Vulnerability and Community Resilience study in various parts of Delhi. Kamala Nehru College was one of the cluster Colleges participating in the Programme.

Objectives

The study was conducted in two phases covering residential/commercial and institutional areas with the objectives of identifying disaster prone areas due to land use changes, the compliance of construction codes and the community resilience factors.

Methodology

The areas were studied from the perspective of vulnerability to disasters like flood, earthquake and fire. Physical vulnerability of the area was highlighted depending on overcrowding, infrastructural density, availability of escape routes and the construction material used. Factors like economic status, literacy levels, social equity and nature of livelihoods were accounted in social vulnerability. To understand these factors, an open-ended questionnaire was designed to inquire about perceptions and occurrence of disaster and resilience to vulnerability created by them. A dedicated team of young student researchers filled in the questionnaires and observed the ground reality.

Study Area

In the first phase, the areas selected included AnandLok, an upper end residential colony; Sadiq Nagar, a middle class structured colony of government officials; Gautam Nagar, a lower middle-class locality with mushrooming PGs, overcrowded lanes and encroached pavements and South extension and HauzKhas market area, placed low on vulnerability index. In phase II, the study was carried out in a unique set up of urban village called ShahpurJat surrounded by upper-end localities like Panchsheel, Siri Fort Complex. HauzKhas Institutional Area and ASIAD village complex.

Major Findings

Strong correlations were observed between the economic status of the residents and their vulnerability to disasters. Rather it was proved that community resilience to disasters is directly proportional to social and demographic variables like levels of literacy, nature of employment and living standards. Areas like Gautam Nagar and ShahpurJat are even more vulnerable to disasters like fire as no building construction codes are followed along with heavy electrical wires lying overhead. Completely based on a Community Outreach approach and Participant Appraisal, the study forms a strong basis of identifying zones strongly prone to disasters.

We wish to take the study further to create a Resilience Atlas for the localities covered by us and to make our college a nodal centre in case a disaster strikes.

B) Shrinkhala

Introduction

The name is given to a society established by KNC a few years ago to form a chain and maintain continuity with the superannuated colleagues most of whom retired after giving three to four decades of invaluable service to the College. Many of them were associated right from the year 1964 when the College was established in Delhi when it was known as Modern College for Women in those days.

Objective

Focus of the society is to understand and acknowledge that no institution can work or forge ahead without participation of all its well wishes and stakeholders. The College needed the essential link to carry forward the active participation of all its stakeholders.

The society is meant to acknowledge the contribution of all who went into making this institution, who saw its growth, gradual expansion and shift to the present location. They nurtured the library book by book and now the College boasts of a three storied library. They arranged spaces inside College, established certain traditions unique to this College right from its inception, such as the theatre society, expressions, debating society among so many others.

Shrinkhala members maintain their connection with college and keep themselves academically active as well by organizing seminars in the college, and sharing their wealth of experience with students and faculty alike.

The society organises a get-together once in a semester where retired colleagues are invited to mingle and also to discuss problems they may be encountering in their lives. The college assists them with pension paper work.

The college library has been made accessible to all the retired colleagues who can borrow books and can use research rooms for their individual work. Medical facility along with counseling services have been made available to them. The Shrinkhala committee members maintain regular contact with those retired colleagues who are too old to come to college and their various needs with regard to paper work are handled by them. During their meet, apart from serious discussions, games and light activities are also organized. Their inputs with regard to functioning of the college are taken seriously and on every important occasion the college makes it a point to invite them. In the college directory, information about their address and telephone numbers are also given to maintain this continuous link.

KNC was the first college to establish this kind of society and it now growing in numbers and stature.

7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection:

- Cleanliness Drive by the students of Green Beans Society once a week.

- The plants in the campus were labelled with their scientific as well as common names to make students familiar about their benefits and account for the diversity of plants in the campus.

Strengths of College

- IQAC in close association and interaction with all stakeholders of the College mapped out steps to improve the academic climate and take it to the next level. The College first encouraged more and more Professors to undertake research with the result that 16 finished their PhD and received their degrees and now 69 per cent of the permanent faculty have a PhD.
- In Kamala Nehru College, 48 per cent of the faculty presented papers at all the three levels and more became part of University syllabi revision committees and a significant number of them have published articles (44 per cent), chapters in books (25 per cent) and books (6) written by the faculty members testifies to their determination to excel and give the best to their students.
- Use of technology in all its available forms has become an established practice in the College. Collaborative efforts are not limited to the College stakeholders; FDPs organised by various departments has led to forming linkages, spreading an academic network, disseminating information for the larger welfare of society.
- These efforts are evident in the form of improved results of the students and extensive research undertaken by students at undergraduate levels preparing them to become competitive yet sensitive individuals. Teaching has been made a more interactive process through the use of varied technological tools. Ample space, facilities and equipment has been made available to all the students.
- More trips outside classrooms have been organised including taking steps to integrate learning with community outreach programs. Efforts have been made to raise environmental consciousness among all the stakeholders of the institution. Committees have been strengthened for cultural expansion of the College societies. They have been encouraged to organise more competitions, interactions and festivals in varied forms and colours. To assist both students and faculty, attempts have been made to strengthen administration by organising skill enhancement programs for them and to increase usage of technology with a lesser reliance on paper work.

Weaknesses:


- Our location is an advantage in many ways, yet it also poses a challenge. Being close to a heritage site, we are unable to expand our covered areas and provide more classrooms and other indoor facilities for our students, as ASI rules discourage additional building in the area. With an increasing number of students being from outside Delhi, we would like to build a hostel, and recognize it as a pressing need; but we are at present unable to provide this facility.
- New appointments have not taken place for long which is the cause of the consistent reshuffle in the allocation of work and responsibilities amongst staff members.

Plans of institution for next year

- The college would continue to strive ahead to provide more academic activities in the form of organization of workshops, national and international seminars; lectures by eminent personalities and community outreach programme to provide more exposure to our students.
- Special orientation programmes for GE and SEC papers under new CBCS will be organized.
- The departments plan to organize FDPs on both academic and research related topics.
- Departments will make concrete efforts to undertake the tasks of career counseling by organizing career fairs and introducing value-aided courses to further benefit the students.
- Departments have begun to establish alumni interaction programmes and are delving into options of getting alumni assistance in varied forms.
- Departments that have laboratory requirements will expand by increasing the number of workstations and process funds to purchase studio/laboratory equipments.
- Outstation academic /field trips and heritage walks, and publication of newsletters will be undertaken. Invitational tournaments in sports will be organized by the college.
- The college plans to hold gender sensitization workshops for faculty and administration.
- To strengthen community feeling with the Northeast students and to look into their issues and problems, special interactive/orientation session will be organized.
- Equal Opportunity Cell to collaborate with Governemnet organization to organize sports activities for visually challenged.
- Extra initiatives for building culture of peace and non-violence, spreading awareness about mindfulness, mental well-being and expansion of cleanliness drive...

Feedback Report

Feedback is one of the mechanisms to improve the working of the institution and to facilitate constant communication with the students, parents and alumnae regarding various aspects of academic, non-academic and infrastructural issues.

Students Feedback:

Kamala Nehru College in order to foster accountability, undertook the second cycle of feedback (post NAAC) of the students of various departments and classes during the month of April 2017 (6th to 11th April) for the session January - May 2017 under the aegis of IQAC. A proper schedule was prepared and the whole exercise was completed in a week's time.

Proper guidelines were given to the Teachers-in-charge of all departments prior to the commencement of feedback. Students from FYUP as well as CBCS, having 67 per cent and above attendance undertook the feedback. The online questionnaire which was bilingual covered aspects pertaining to quality of teaching, infrastructure, administrative functioning, extra-curricular activities, etc. The feedback not only aimed at the overall assessment of the college and faculty but also self-assessment of the students through questions on regularity of classes, assignments, and participation in co-curricular activities, lab and library facilities, etc.

The feedback report/analysis was shared with all the departments. Certain observations were made:

- Appropriate time for the feedback exercise is mid academic session, when the classes are in full swing.
- The response of the students pertaining to usage of innovative and interactive techniques, redressal of academic concerns, facilities and infrastructure, reflect that further improvement is possible.

For this term's feedback, the IQAC decided for representative sample fixing the number of students on the basis their regularity in the classes. Certain departments had fewer participants. The IQAC will ensure that numbers of participants increase in the next round of Feedback.

Another aspect noticed where the college needs to look into is smooth interaction of administration with the students. The students gave the most positive responses to resources and accessibility in library.

The response of the B.A. Program students, regarding the issue of regularity of classes needs attention as all departments are involved in teaching this particular course. The B.A. program students expressed the desire to have their association to participate in co-curricular involvement within the department.

IQAC is open to suggestions and looks forward to working towards improvement in academic and non-academic realms with continual improvement in the feedback process. It intends to incorporate issues related to outstation students, interdisciplinary curriculum, etc. and views and aspirations of new as well as old batches of students for upkeep and efficient working of the institution, in the next feedback exercise. This will be held in the academic session July - December 2017 and January – May 2018.

Feedback Analysis of Parents:

In the month of August and September 2016, the college invited the parents to receive inputs and feedback regarding the institution and their experience based on the feedback provided by their wards. It was an interactive meeting between the interim IQAC, few faculty members, students representatives and parents. The point of discussion revolved around how better facilities could be provided along with expansion of infrastructure, particularly the hostel facility for outstation students. The parents wished to hold more such meetings on regular basis and also suggested for contribution towards the welfare of the institution. This being the first meeting, the pattern of feedback remained to be personal and interactive and it was decided that the college would eventually through IQAC formalize the parents' feedback through online mode for wider participation from the parents' end.

Feedback Analysis of the Alumnae:

The meeting of few former students placed in Delhi took place in the month of July 2016. The members of Madhursmriti (Alumnae Association, KNC) along with IQAC team took this initiative which was happening for the first time in the college. It was suggested that Alumnae Association should be formally registered and elect office bearers so that regular meeting and contribution from the alumnae could be possible. The college acted promptly on the suggestion and KNC Alumane Association was formally registered and now the Alumnae Association is in the process of building a community that can support the academic and co/extra-curricular activities of college. Dr. Amrita Bajaj(former student), the Deputy Dean of Students Welfare, University of Delhi helped college arrange the 'Open House Session' prior to admissions in June 2017.
