PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Namaskar! Warm greetings to all virtually present here! I would like to welcome our honorable Chief Guest, Prof C. Rajkumar, Vice Chancellor, O.P. Jindal University, our distinguished Guest of Honour, Lt General Madhuri Kanitkar, AVSM, VSM. I also take this opportunity to welcome our Governing Body Chairperson, Mrs Suman Chauhan, Treasurer Mr. Anwar Shahid and other respected GB Members, invited guests, media personnel, teaching faculty, our superannuated staff, non-teaching staff, support staff, and my very dear students.

To begin with I express my concern for the well being of all during this Covid-19 pandemic situation. Even as the world around is not what it used to be, we, at Kamala Nehru College have decided to resist pessimism and foster new hope by continuing with our long standing tradition of celebrating our College Day virtually today. In this Annual Report, I would like to present a brief account of our achievements and accomplishments on the academic, co-curricular and the extra-curricular front over the last calendar year, 2019.

Our Distinct Achievements

It is an honour to report that Kamala Nehru College has been selected as the Mentor Institution under the 'Paramarsh' Scheme of UGC following the 'Quality mandate' in higher education. Kamala Nehru College is one of the four colleges in Delhi University to be awarded 'Paramarsh' for mentoring the mentee institutions to enable them to get NAAC accreditation by 2022. Our Mentee institutions are Aryabhatt College, Satyawati College (E), Motilal Nehru College (E) and Indian Institute of Design and Craft, Jaipur. It proves that our College as a well performing institution is rendering high order service to promote Quality Assurance in Higher Education.

This year is marked with excellence in research projects when Kamala Nehru College in collaboration with Department of Philosophy, DU has been awarded with SPARC (Scheme for Promotion of Academic and Research Collaboration) by the Ministry of Human Resource and Development, Govt. of India and IIT Kharagpur for 2019-2021 on *Yoga Consciousness in Mahābhārata and Bhagavadgītā: The Ethical Value for Societal/Political Wellbeing*. Dr Geetesh Nirban is the Co-Principal Investigator and the amount sanctioned is over 73 Lakhs towards the same. For the first time KNC co-hosted a seven-day international Residential Seminar on *Happiness and Good Life: Philosophical Reflections through Cultures* for which Dr. Nirban received a funding of 3 Lakhs from the Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR) and MHRD, Govt of India. Kamala Nehru College bagged two prestigious projects under IMPRESS scheme of ICSSR awarded to Dr. Pravati Dalua in July 2019 on

"Gender, Mobility and Informal Entrepreneurship in Contemporary Handicraft Industries" and "Green Consumption in India: A Study of Changing Organic Food Consumption Patterns in Delhi And Bhubaneswar". Dr. Nupur Ray along with Dr. Bijoylaxmi Nanda has secured the ICSSR awarded Research Programme, 'Declining Child Sex-Ratio and Violence against Women: Examining Girl-Child Discrimination in India'.

This is an appropriate moment to proudly acknowledge the higher academic pursuits and accomplishments of our faculty members. Dr. Carmel Christy successfully completed fellowship at the International Institute for Asian Studies, Leiden, the Netherlands, from December 2018- October 2019. She also successfully completed fellowship at CEM- FMSH, Paris, from October to November 2019. Dr. Carmel Christy was invited as the jury member of the Dissertation Prize Judging Committee of International Convention of Asian Scholars 2021 (Kyoto). She organised an International Workshop in Paris on October 25, 2019 on the topic "Making of the Southwest Indian Littoral: Trade, Religion and Marginality". Dr. Rupali Khanna successfully completed her post doctoral research fellowship from Nanyang Technological University, Singapore, ranked 11th in the world in the 2020 QS University rankings. Her three projects focused on energy poverty, clean energy and green spaces, culminating in the publication of two papers in international journals and one international policy document.

In terms of our international presence, Shivpreet Pannu secured the first position in Asian Youth Championship 2019 in female junior Speed Climbing. Kirti Gupta won Gold medal in junior category at the 9th Asian Shotgun Championship held at Kazakhstan. She also won team Silver and mixed team Bronze medal at the 9th Asian Shotgun Championship held at Kazakhstan in 2019. In September 2019, KNC hosted the 2nd Indo-German Film Festival on 'Active Ageing' organized by the Sociology Department in collaboration with the German Embassy.

It is a matter of pride for KNC that our very able and bright cadets CHM Khushi Bharadwaj, Cadet Poonam and Cadet Angel represented the Delhi Directorate in Republic Day Camp in January 2019, which was held at Rajpath, New Delhi. CHM Khushi Bharadwaj was awarded with the All India Junior Under Officer Rank in the camp. On 8th September, 2019 the members of Green Beans, the environment society of KNC participated in the UN dialogue with Deputy Secretary General Amina J. Mohammed on Sustainable Development Agenda and the need for Climate Action. 15 volunteers of NSS, KNC shared space with innovators, artists, change-makers and social entrepreneurs at Indian Habitat Centre on 5th August 2019 for the #CharchaForChange: Climate Chapter discussion hosted by United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and to discuss ideas, innovations and solutions to combat the climate crisis.

In November 2019, the student convenors of Luminoso, the Fine Arts Society Anoushka Gogoi and Shagun Dhir, represented our college at the India International Science Festival, held in Kolkata. They participated in the exhibition of handmade art and crafts products prepared by our fine arts team. This has been a part of encouraging students to take up their creative abilities at professional level, designated as "Passion to Profession". These products were highly appreciated by the visitors.

Lectures

The culture of invited lectures and discussions at KNC is a long-standing one, which has thrived over years in the academic environment of the college. The 15th Dr. K.K. Gorowara Annual Memorial Lecture 2019 was delivered by the award winning writer Ms. Githa Hariharan on the 16th of April 2019 on the topic: "Becoming the Tide: The writer as Citizen." The speaker for the "Dr. Radhakrishnan Memorial Lecture Series" held on 05 September, 2019 was Prof. Heeraman Tiwari, Dean, Atal Bihari Vajpayee School of Management and Entrepreneurship, JNU, who spoke on "Matilal, Memory and Indian Theory of Knowledge".

The annual Plural Eco Lecture was delivered by Professor Arun Kumar on the topic, "Two Circles of growth in India." In the month of January, the English Department welcomed the Cypriot poet, critic and academic Stephanos Stephanides. The English Literary Society collaborated with the Book Club of KNC to organize a lecture-demonstration on 'Daryagani's Parallel Book History'. In March 2019, the Book Club collaborated with the History department to organise a Dastangoi performance with Fouzia Dastango and Saneya Dastango. The History Department invited Prof. Raziuddin Aquil, who spoke on "Akbar and Aurangzeb: Religion and Political Culture in Early Modern India". The Mathematics Department organized an interactive session with Mr. Ayaan Chawla founder and CEO of Asian Fox Developments who delivered a talk on the start-up culture in India. Dr. Geetha Venkataraman, Professor, Ambedkar University gave a lecture on 'Groups and Symmetry'. The Political Science Department organized a talk in August 2019 by the representatives from Amnesty International, India on 'Decoders: A Session on Troll Patrol India'. The Department also organized a book discussion on the book The Line on Fire authored by Prof. Happymon Jacob. In the month of March, 2019 the BA Programme Committee organized a first of its kind Youth Conclave on the theme of 'Education'.

Seminars and Panel Discussions

Seminars, workshops, panel discussions and academic talks are a routine feature of the KNC intellectual climate. The Sanskrit Department organized a ten-day Sanskrit Sambhashan Karyashala in the month of August 2019. It also hosted a

one-day National Seminar on "Anbhovaad Vimarsh" sponsored by Shri Shanker Shikshayatan, Delhi. The Seminar was graced by many eminent speakers of the discipline. In the month of September, the Hindi Department organized a two-day UGC sponsored National Seminar on the topic: "Ikkisvi Sadi ka Hindi Katha Sahitya: Chintan ki Vividh Dishayein" wherein Late Dr. Ganga Prasad Vimal delivered the keynote address.

The Sociology Department organized a two-day ICSSR sponsored National Seminar on "Environmental crisis, ethics and social justice: A critical perspective". The Psychology Department organized a seminar on 'Community Mental Health' by Ms Achira Chatterjee an expert on the issue of mental health, and in October, 2019 the Department also organized a panel discussion with diverse perspectives on Suicide Prevention. This was in continuation of the 'Yellow Silent March' organized to raise awareness about mental health issues. Ms Saniya Bedi, the college counsellor held an interactive session on self-love. The session included some activities on self-love, self-esteem and self-awareness. The Consumer Club of KNC organized a Seminar on "Consumer Rights and Protection Awareness" in August 2019. Dr Jayshree Gupta, Director, Consumer India and Dr. Sushila, Project Director from National Law University, Delhi spoke on the occasion.

Workshops

The culture of academic discussions and lectures is further reinforced by workshops conducted for the students and the faculty. The Geography Department organized a month long distance-learning programme in October, 2019 on Geographical Information Systems (GIS) in collaboration with IIRS (Indian Institute of Remote Sensing), Dehradun. The Commerce Department organized a one-day workshop on 'Principles of Marketing' in September 2019, and another on "Cyber Space, Crimes and Security". Mr Anyesh Roy, DCP Cyber Crime Cell and other prominent speakers addressed the students. The Economics Department organized a GRETL Software Workshop conducted by Ms. Nupur Kataria. A Print Production Workshop was organized for the final year students of Journalism in August 2019 conducted by Ms. Ruchika Mahajan, Faculty member of NISCORT, New Delhi. The Physical Education Department organized a Fitness Workshop on 'Health and Wellness' under Fit India Movement for NSO students conducted by Dr. Sarita Tyagi from Indira Gandhi College of Physical Education and Sports Sciences. The Geography department organized a one-day faculty development workshop on data analysis with R, using STATCRAFT. In September 2019, the members of Snapshots, the Photography Society conducted a peer workshop on technicalities of photography. On 6th November, a workshop on 'Hormonal Health and Nutrition' was conducted by TheaCare in association with Women's Development Cell.

Educational Field Trips

Like workshops, educational field trips also provide a hands-on experience to students. An industrial visit to Parle was organized by the Commerce Department. The members of the English Department visited the Kiran Nadar Museum of Art for a curated walkthrough of their collection and an exhibition called 'Common Course'. The History Department organized a multi-disciplinary walk to Rashtrapati Bhawan. The final year Journalism students of the DSE Photography course were taken on a study trip to the Museo Camera Centre for the Photographic Arts, a vintage camera museum in Gurugram in November 2019. The Sociology Department organized a field visit to Kiran Nadar Museum of Art to sociologically engage with the work display of Dr. Ishita Dey and Dr. Mohammed Saeed entitled 'Smells of the city: Scents, Stench and Stink'.

Co-curricular and Extra-curricular Activities

At KNC co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are encouraged with a view towards holistic development. There are more than a dozen cultural and performing arts societies in the College like classical music, western music, dance, fashion, dramatics, choreography, Hindi and English debate, quiz, fine arts etc. KNC follows the best practice of providing training to the members of such societies every semester through weekend workshops, where students get the opportunity to interact with distinguished trainers and experts. Glitz, the KNC Fashion Society won the best fashion team in Vogue at IIT Mumbai festival Mood Indigo as well as at Maitreyi College and Shaheed Bhagat Singh College. It secured second position at Hindu, Shivaji and the College of Vocational Studies. At the individual level too, the members won several trophies for 'Best model' at Hindu, Maitreyi, Lady Irwin, Ramanujan, Shivaji, College of Vocational Studies, Institute of Home Economics, Institute of Management Studies and Shaheed Bhagat Singh College.

Another landmark event at KNC is 'Munaazrah' organized by 'Crossfire', the English Debating Society. In March 2019, it hosted the 4th Annual Asian Parliamentary Debating Tournament in which over 36 teams participated from various institutions across India such as IIT-Delhi, St. Stephen's, Delhi College of Economics and JNU, among many other reputed ones.

Sangeetika, the Indian Music Society secured the first position at Indraprastha College and the second position at Gargi, Swami Shraddhanand College and DCAC. The achievements of the societies are too many to be recounted here. Spenta Jassawala, a second year Journalism honours' student and member of Snapshots, the Photography Society secured the first position in an online

photography competition organized by the Global Youth Mumbai on the theme 'Life under Water.'

The annual cultural festival, Ullas'19 was held on 13 and 14 March 2019. Renowned Kathak dancer and film maker, Ms. Arushi Nishank inaugurated the event, and mesmerized the audience with her powerful speech on women's empowerment and environmental concerns. The professional band performance by 'Antariksh' and the much-awaited celebrity event with the popular playback singer, Darshan Raval, were the highlights of the college festival, Ullas.

Gender Awareness and Sensitization

Gender sensitization is an ongoing discourse at KNC. In January 2019, the Placement Cell of KNC organized a panel discussion on "Women in Leadership: Career and Growth Prospects" in collaboration with Change.org, wherein eminent women leaders, Ms. Sushmita Dev, Member of Parliament, Congress and Ms Shweta Shalini, Spokesperson, Bharatiya Janata Party discussed the role of women and career opportunities in politics.

In November 2019, as part of the History Lecture Series, Prof. Kumkum Roy and Dr. Charu Gupta spoke on the gender perspective in Ancient and Modern India. The newly introduced Young Economist Lecture and Discussion Series (YELD) under the aegis of the Economics Department hosted Professor Jayati Ghosh, who spoke on "Gender and Economics." The Journalism Department organized a bilingual panel discussion in which Ms. Purvi Gupta from 'She the People', and Laxmi Sharma from 'Khabar Lehariya' discussed the issues of representation of minorities and challenges faced by women reporters. The Psychology Department held a seminar on 'Women's Health' addressed by Dr. Rahul Manchanda, Gynae Endoscopic Surgeon. The NSS unit of Kamala Nehru College organised a workshop on POCSO (Prevention of Children from Sexual Offences) and gender equality conducted by Sakshi NGO. It also organized "PRIDE 2019" on 6th September 2019, in collaboration with Nazariya, a queer youth alliance and social justice advocacy group operating in Delhi. On 8th March, on the occasion of International Women's Day, Women's Development Cell collaborated with the Public Service Broadcasting Trust (PSBT) to host a one-day film festival where five short films were screened on the theme of sexuality. From August to October, Breakthrough, an organization focusing on issues related to violence and discrimination against women, conducted a training programme for the students.

Institutional Social Responsibility

In the domain of co-curricular activities, NCC and NSS shouldered wider social responsibility as an integral part of education. Our cadets have successfully executed various extension activities in collaboration with industry, community and non-government organisations during the past year, like Swachh Bharat

Rally in collaboration with Andrews Ganj MCD School; Food distribution at Lajpat Nagar; Cleanathon conducted in Sarojini Nagar, followed by a Plantation Drive at Gulmohar Park. The NSS unit of KNC organized cleanliness drives in the month of August 2019 in four phases to mark the Swacchta Pakhwada under the guidance of the Programme officer, Ms. Namita Paul. Kendriya Vidyalaya, Sadiq Nagar and the Green Park Market were cleaned as part of this drive. On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, the NSS Unit of KNC organised a cleanliness drive in the college campus to contribute to Swachh Bharat Abhiyan to commemorate Gandhiji's 150th birth anniversary. The NSS mobilized the college community to curb Single Use Plastic under Swacchta Hi Sewa Abhiyan. NSS KNC was also honoured to be a part of the National Mission for Clean Ganga, organised on 4th November, 2019 at Dhyanchand National Stadium by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India.

Our extension activities have contributed to the nation building exercise. Khushi Kapoor, an NSS member from Psychology (Hons) was appointed as the SVEEP College Campus Ambassador, to increase voter awareness and facilitate the registration of voters in the electoral rolls in collaboration with the Election Commission of India. The college makes a significant contribution in nation-building by providing infrastructural support to elections of Loksabha and Vidhan Sabha, as the college ground and building are used for months altogether as Training Centre for the elections. The College observed the second anniversary of the Surgical Strike and also celebrated Kargil Diwas on 26th July 2019 with Colonel Vijendra Thapar, father of Kargil hero Lt Vijayant Thapar as the Chief Guest, and the National Constitution Day on the 26th of November. On the occasion of National Unity Day on 31st October, the NSS unit of KNC took the unity pledge.

The College has been working towards extension activities and institutional social responsibility through its cultural societies too, like the Equal Opportunity Cell, Gandhi Study Circle, Consumer Club and Green Beans. The Equal Opportunity Cell of KNC signed an MoU with 'Inside Me', an NGO wherein our students regularly visit their schools to help them in art and craft. The society also marked the 'International Cane Day' in College premises to sensitize people about the importance of white cane in the life of the visually impaired. A community outreach programme was also organised in two blind schools of Delhi, wherein the members interacted with blind students, listening to their thoughts and stories and sharing the same with them. Under the aegis of Consumer Club, Kamala Nehru College became the proud partner of The Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation Consumer Campaign, run by the celebrated Children Rights activist and the Nobel Peace Prize recipient, Shri Kailash Satyarthi. The Gandhi Study Circle of the College celebrated various activities throughout the year to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of

Gandhi ji, like the annual 'Charkha Utsav' first celebrated in 2017. An 'Ahimsa Silk Exhibition' was put up by NSDTI, Madhya Pradesh, as part of Gandhi Vandan, the annual event organized to remember Gandhi ji on 30th January 2019. Dr. Neena Bansal, faculty member of KNC received an award for 'Best Contribution as Convenor of Gandhi Study Circle' towards "Spreading Gandhian Values among College Youth and Fraternity" at Gandhi Bhawan, and that speaks volumes about our commitment to Gandhian ideology.

Also worth applause is the Green Beans' commitment to sustainable development. In November 2019, the College canteen composting plant was inaugurated and a short training programme for the students and the canteen staff was conducted by Mr. TRN Rao, who has been associated with Swarn Vasudha, an organization working on household composting. Mr Rao demonstrated the process of composting using the biodegradable waste from the College canteen and also vertical gardens for growing organic vegetables on terraces. In a unique initiative of Green Beans Society, the students calculated the water footprint of a representative sample of 800 students at Kamala Nehru College. The survey was conducted using the water footprint calculator developed by the researchers at UNESCO-IHE from waterfootprint.org. The water footprint of 74 % of the students lies between 400-1899 cubic meter per year. The study was conducted to make students aware about the judicious use of water by reducing their personal water footprint for a sustainable future. Here it is worth mentioning that India is the country with the largest water footprint in the world.

Active social engagement is also the vision of the Placement Cell of KNC. Our students have been placed in companies like KPMG, EY, Wipro, Tresvista and others. The Cell provided internship and live project opportunities to our students. Major recruiters included the Yes Foundation, Consumers India, Glinks International, Decathlon, among the 30+ companies that approached the College. The Placement Cell continued with its 'Career Guidance Series' and the sessions were conducted by Mr Jitin Chawla, a prominent placement expert. The Placement Cell introduced a new platform named 'Government Jobs and Scholarship Opportunities' in the year 2019-20, whereby it has successfully oriented students towards highlighting opportunities in sectors like Judiciary, Indian Forest Services, Delhi Police, SBI, LIC, RBI and many more.

Sports

Sports is yet another field of excellence at KNC. Amongst the numerous laurels, I would like to mention that Medha Saini won Gold Medal in the 1st Champions Open National Taekwondo Championship held at Talkatora Indoor Stadium and also at the Delhi State Taekwondo Championship, held at Tyagraj Stadium. Priya won Gold Medal in 100 meters Hurdle in Delhi State Athletics meet held

at JLNS. Our football and basketball teams secured top positions in intervarsity and state level tournaments.

Superannuated Members of KNC

The College bid farewell to two members of the non-teaching staff in 2019, Shri Shankar (Security staff) and Smt Dayawati (Sanitary staff). At this juncture, I would take the opportunity to acknowledge Dr. Manju Gupta, a retired faculty member from the Hindi Department, for her generous donation of 2.5 lakh for student scholarships.

Administrative Accomplishments

Adopting the welfare approach, many students and staff friendly facilities have been furnished. Four sanitary napkins vending machines have been installed in rest rooms and common room. State bank of India's mobile ATM van has been made available daily for the ease of staff and students. The tactile paths have been laid out in the college and ramps constructed in New Seminar Room in order to make the college infrastructure accessible for all. An e-resources section for the students has been set up in the library with 12 work stations. The teachers' Research room in the library has been renovated and equipped with laptops on all the desks with wifi connectivity. The area around bamboo rooms has been landscaped as 'Nature Square' with lotus pond murals painted on the walls in miniature style by the Fine Arts Society students. A real time temperature and humidity display has been installed on the boundary wall overlooking the busy intersection of Siri Fort Road and August Kranti Marg, for the benefit of people passing by the college. Another initiative worth appreciation is the installation of the e-waste bin in the college lobby, and an MoU signed with Chintan, an NGO working on waste management for responsible disposal of electronic-waste by licensed recycling units. Another MoU has been signed with the NGO, Family of Disabled (FOD), whereby old newspapers are provided for making pencils out of recycled paper to generate employment for the differently-abled people. With the aim of strengthening the alumnae network, the alumnae association, Madhursmriti has started an online registration portal that was formally declared open at the annual Alumnae Meet of 2019. The first annual general body meeting (AGM) was held on the 9th of November 2019. The election of the office bearers of the Students' Union was combined with the election of student representatives of Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) in a smooth manner. KNC has been selected as centre for conducting many reputed entrance exams by outsourced test agencies.

Awards and Recognition

Last but not the least, I would like to showcase the individual achievements of the members of the faculty. Dr. Kalpana Bhakuni received a National Award, Bhugol Shastra Bhushan from the Deccan Geographical Society of India in September 2019. Dr. Renu Bali was the recepient of the Award for College Lecturers given by Directorate of Higher Education, Delhi Government for the year 2019. Dr. Sushma Choudhary of the Sanskrit Department received the Krantidhara Antrarashtriya Sahitya Sadhak Samman-2019 at Meerut Literary Festival, and various other awards for her academic and cultural contribution. Ms. Homolata Borah received the 'Mary Fran Myers Scholarship Award' from Natural Hazards Centre, University of Colorado, USA in 2019. Ms. Shikha Gupta of the Commerce department won the award for Best Paper Presentation at an International Conference organised by Global Research Foundation.

Faculty Achievements

In 2019, two of our faculty members were awarded PhD: Dr. Divya Padalia from JNU and Dr. Vaishali Narula from National Institute of Education Planning and Administration.

Dr. Nupur Ray from the Political Science jointly edited a volume, *Discourse on Rights in India: Debates and Dilemmas* published by Routledge in 2019. Dr. Chetna Sharma co-edited the book titled *Comparative Government and Politics* published by Sage in 2019. Dr. Pragati Gautam of Mathematics Department has authored *Numerical Method* and co-authored with Ms Swapnil Verma *Practical Mathematica*, text books for UG students in 2019. Dr. Shweta Suri published a book on Sports Injuries. Mr. Ramesh Aroli's poems have been translated into Spanish language and published in a special Indian issue of "LUVINA-97", a literary magazine published by the University of Guadalajara, México in 2019.

A large number of faculty members have attended, as well as presented papers at international and national forums, the details of which are included in the relevant sections of the Annual Report. Many others have contributed 'Chapters' to books, and published articles in peer-reviewed international, national and e-journals of repute. Various members have been invited as Speakers at International Conferences, Workshop Resource Persons and as Guest Editors of journals, as well as chaired sessions. The members of the faculty are also actively involved in syllabi conceptualization and revision, spearheading committees across levels in the University of Delhi.

Time constraint prevents me from mentioning the numerous other achievements of the College. They, however, find a place in the detailed College Report. On this congratulatory note, I would like to conclude by once again extending my gratitude to the Dignitaries present here, and all those associated with KNC, who have believed in our progressive vision. DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

COMMERCE

Commcentric, the Commerce Association organized various events from January-December 2019in keeping with the department's vision to provide holistic education to the students. On 17th January, the Commerce Association organized its Annual Departmental Day- COMMXCELSIOR 2019. Various inter-college competitions such as Quiz-A-Thon, Ad-Mad Competition, Mock Stock, IPL, Group Discussion, Biz Craft and Hunt Mania were hosted, in which 1500 students participated. A huge footfall of more than 3500 students from different colleges of University of Delhi and other prestigious universities such as Delhi Technical University, Jamia Millia Islamia and others participated in the fest. The department organized a Faculty Development Programme on "Cyber Space, Crimes and Security", which was well attended byfaculty members and students from various colleges across Delhi. The Chief Guest for the day was Mr Anyesh Roy, DCP Cyber Crime Cell, Delhi. Dr. Sunaina Kanojia, Associate Professor, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi and Mr Rahul Tyagi, Co-Founder and VP of Lucideus were the speakers who enlightened the participants and students with their expertise on the subject. A one-day Workshop on 'Principles of Marketing' was organized on 28th September, 2019. The keynote speaker Prof. Madan Lal, other speakers Dr. Amit Kumar Singh, Dr. Ashish Chandra, Dr. H K Dangi from Department of Commerce, Delhi School of Economics addressed the faculty members present from different colleges. An Industrial Visit to Parle was organized by the Commerce Department on October 18, 2019 in which 60 students and five faculty members visited the Parle factory at Bahadurgarh.

ECONOMICS

The Department of Economics organized a wide range such activities throughout the year 2019. The Annual Departmental Day – Ecophoria was held on 29th January, 2019. The inaugural lecture was delivered by Prabir Purkayastha, Founder of Newsclick, Founder Member of Delhi Science Forum, President of Free Software Movement of Indian Engineers and Science Activist on "Historical Materialism". It was followed by various inter-college competitions such as Paper Presentation, Start-Up Challenge, Connectonomics, Quiz Pro Quo, Ad Mad, Monopoly, Treasure Hunt and the Triviazard Tournament which saw active participation of more than 1500 students from many prestigious colleges and universities across Delhi and Delhi-NCR. The Economics Department conducted their annual Fresher's Debate on 28th August, 2019 to provide an opportunity for the newcomers to step out of their comfort zones and interact with the department faculty and seniors with a sense of healthy competition. The topic for the debate was "Does globalization necessarily lead to sustainable development across the globe?" The first session of the Annual

Plural Economics Lecture Series was organized by the department with Professor Arun Kumar, former Professor at the Centre for Economic Studies and Planning, JNU and currently the Malcolm Adisheshiah Chair Professor at the Institute of Social Sciences as the speaker of the session on 25th September, 2019. The lecture comprised of an extensive discussion on the current state of the Indian Economy. with the topic being "Two Circles of Growth in India". The Department of Economics conducted the 55th A.D. Shroff Memorial Elocution Competition on 22nd October, 2019 with the objective of encouraging students to think and speak on Economics and other subjects, besides enabling them to display their oratory skills. There was participation by around 15 students from various departments of the college and all of them put their best foot forward. On 2nd November, 2019 the Economics Department organized a GRETL Software Workshop conducted by Ms. Nupur Kataria, Assistant Professor, Maitreyi Collge, University of Delhi. This workshop was well received by the students for gaining a good understanding of statistics and improving their quantitative skills. A new addition to the Economics Department was the Young Economist Lecture and Discussion Series (YELD). It is an initiative undertaken by the students of the Economics Department in pursuit of open discussions on the various issues concerning our economy. The first lecture session hosted Professor Jayati Ghosh, Head of the Centre for Economic Studies and Planning, JNU as the acclaimed speaker on 5th November, 2019. The theme for the session was "Gender and Economics. The session was followed by a questionanswer round which saw inquisitive participation by students as well as teachers.

ENGLISH

The English Department and its Literary Society organized a number of academic and extra-curricular activities during the year, 2019. On 30th January, the department welcomed Cypriot poet, critic and academic, Stephanos Stephanides for an interactive session with the students. He read out from his latest collection of poetry, and also spoke about the state of writing in the contemporary world. The Literary Society organized its annual department day Litluminous 2019 on 15th February, the theme for which was 'Detection Though the Ages', to explore how 'detection' as a genre in literature and cinema has evolved over the last two centuries. The event commenced with a panel on the theme. Prof Christel Devadawson (Department of English, University of Delhi) spoke on 'Historical Witness and Golden Age Fiction'; Mr Maxwell Pereira (Former Joint Commissioner of Delhi Police) discussed his book The Tandoor Murder: The Crime that Shook a Nation and Brought a Government to its Knees (Westland, 2018); Ms Namita Paul (Department of English, Kamala Nehru College) made a presentation on detection in spy thrillers in contemporary Hindi cinema. The other events of the day were: creative writing competition, student paper presentation, quiz competition on the world of detective fiction (in collaboration with Kaleidscope-the Quiz Society of KNC) and a mystery room game. The event was supported by the contributions of Juggernaut Books, Wattpad and Shelfebook. On 9th March, the department organized a heritage trip to the Sunder Nursery. On 26th March, the students put up their biannual art exhibition, Collective Rubbish on the theme 'Mind Banter'. The students creatively attempted to redefine the ideas associated with Psychoanalysis in literature and visual arts. Continuing its association with IIT-Delhi's literary society, the department organised the prelims for the 'Spellathon' (spelling bee) competition as part of their annual literary festival, Literati, on 5th September. The faculty and

students of the department visited the Kiran Nadar Museum of Art on 14th September for a curated walkthrough of their collection and an exhibition called 'Common Course'. As per its memorandum of understanding with Shelfebook, the society organized a 'Tell-a-Tale', a session on writing on 18th September. Shelfebook is a platform committed to enabling the reading habit amidst students and teachers at educational institutions, selling books at a price as low as Re. 1. The literary society organized its biannual art exhibition Collective Rubbish on the theme 'Best from Waste(land)' on 15th October. The focus of this edition of the exhibition was to explore Modernism as an art and philosophical movement and its impact on literature. The exhibits included painting, performance and digital art. On 23rd October, the English literary society collaborated with the Book Club to organize a lecture-demonstration on 'Daryaganj's Parallel Book History'. The lecture was given by Ms Kanupriya Dhingra, PhD Scholar, School of Oriental and African Studies, London, based on her research on the informal book markets in Delhi. The final event for the semester was the screening of Hanif Kureishi's film My Beautiful Laundrette, on 6th November.

GEOGRAPHY

The Geography department organized a series of events throughout the year 2019. engaging the students in enriching experiences. Geography Day, the annual day of the department was organized on the 4th November with a lot of zest among students. The session started with a film on Ladakh made by Dr Krishanand, along with a discussion by a senior geographer, Dr Premendra Parihar. Ms Bhamini Jain, climate activist interacted with the students and discussed various facets of climate change. The students organized other events like slam poetry, treasure hunt, quiz, pictionary etc. These events had participation from many undergraduate colleges of Delhi University. The department also released its newsletter 'Riptide' on this special day. The department organized a distance learning programme on learning GIS in collaboration with IIRS (Indian Institute of Remote Sensing) Dehradun from 25th September to 24th October 2019, which was attended by 28 students of the fifth semester. The students received a certificate on completing an online exam. The Geography department organized a one-day faculty department workshop on data analysis with R, using STATCRAFT on November 15, 2019. It was well attended by participants from several Delhi University colleges.

HISTORY

The Department of History began the year 2019 with a day-long workshop on Cultural heritage and preservation at INTACH attended by five students and faculty member, Ms. Jayanti Bala Gupta. On 6th February 2019, Ms. Vinita Malik along with a few students attended a conversation with Carlo Ginzburg. The students had an opportunity to interact and learn new insights on research methodology from Prof. Aparna Vaidik on 18th February, 2019. Dr. Archana Ojha took an interdisciplinary walk to Rashtrapati Bhawan on 21st February where teachers from English, Political Science and Geography also participated. The Annual Department Day was organized on 28th March where Prof. Awadhendra Sharan delivered the inaugural Lecture on "The Nature of Air: Historical Reflections", followed by apanel discussion by Prof Farhat Hasan, Prof Seema Bawa and Dr. Charu Gupta on Masculinity and

Feminity. The department day concluded with a performance by Dastangoi performed by Fouzia Dastango and Saneya. On April 27, 2019 the department bid adieu to the batch of 2016-2019, with a medley of old songs and dance and an interactive session. The department welcomed the new batch of 2019 with an interactive session.Ms. Vinita Malik took the first year students to National Museum on 25th September.A team of four students represented the department at a competition at India Lost and Found at the UNESCO office on 4th October. On 18th October, 2019, Prof. Raziuddin Aquil enlightened the History students with his insights on "Akbar and Aurangzeb: Religion and Political Culture in Early Modern India". On 8th November, 2019, the department organized a double lecture as part of the History lecture series where Prof. Kumkum Roy along with Dr. Charu Gupta enlightened the students with the gender perspective in Ancient and Modern India.

JOURNALISM

Journo Junction 2019, the annual academic event of the Department of Journalism was held on 7th February 2019. The theme of the academicfestival was 'Media and Marginalities: Issues and Concerns'. Unveiling of the departmental student publication: Communiqué, by the keynote speaker, Rituparna Chatterjee and Principal Dr Kalpana Bhakuni marked the inauguration of the event. Ms Chatterjee, a correspondent with Reporters Without Borders also runs the twitter handle @indiametoo. She discussed the realities of representation of minorities within and by the media. She further spoke about the recent #Metoo movements and its impact in media workspaces. The keynote address was followed by a bilingual panel discussion entitled 'Mirroring the absence: Communities, Spaces and Issues of Equality' by Purvi Gupta from She the People TV and Laxmi Sharma from Khabar Lehariya. They discussed the issues of representation of minorities and challenges faced by women reporters. They also explored the scope and ground level implications activism recent cyber movements like #MeToo #SmashBrahamanicalPatriarchy. While Laxmi Sharma shared the difficulties faced by Female Dalit reporters on the field, Purvi Gupta discussed the challenges and scope for women reporters online. The final session was entitled 'Locating Marginalization: Caste, Sexuality and Media'. Queer activist Vikram Aditya Sahai and Founder and Director of Project Mukti, Sanghapali Aruna spoke about the issue at length. Aruna shed light on the abysmal condition of news reportage when subjects of the report are Dalit and especially Dalit women. Furthermore, Sahai discussed how the contemporary media treats news relating to the LGBTQ+ in a discriminatory and biased manner. Citing various examples, they challenged and educated the audience of budding journalists on reportage of sexual and caste-based violence. Along with academic sessions, various competitions and entertainment programs were also held at the festival. Students from different colleges enthusiastically participated in Feature writing competition, Photography competition, Harry Potter Quiz, Meme making contest, Slam poetry battle and Treasure hunt. The festival culminated with a standup comedy act by Comedian Parvez Hassan and a performance by the band Awaan. A Print Production Workshop was organized for the final year students of Journalism on 30th August, 2019. The workshop was conducted by Ms. Ruchika Mahajan, Faculty member of NISCORT, New Delhi. The students were imparted training in DTP (Desk top publishing) and the computer softwares Adobe Photoshop and InDesign at the workshop. The third year students of the DSE Photography course were taken on a study trip to the Museo Camera Centre for the Photographic Arts, a vintage camera museum on 8th November, 2019. They were taken on a tour of the museum by its founder, Mr Aditya Arya who also explained the evolution of the camera as an image recording device.

MATHEMATICS

The Department of Mathematics organized its Annual Departmental Day, "Omicron" on 31st October, 2019. The chief guests of the day were Mr Ayaan Chawla, founder and CEO of Asian Fox Developments and Dr. Geetha Venkataraman, Professor, Ambedkar University, Delhi. The speaker of the day was Prof. Heeraman Tiwari, DeanAtal Bihari Vajpayee School of Management and Entrepreneurship, Jawaharlal Nehru University, Prof. CHS, SSS, JNU, Prof. and Chairperson, CMS, SSS, JNU, Coordinator, UGC-CAS, CHS, SSS, JNU, & Concurrent Professor, School of Sanskrit & Indic Studies, who spoke on "Matilal, Memory and Indian Theory of Knowledge".

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The Department of Physical Education organized "Fitnessista workshop" under Fit India Movement for NSO students in the month of October, 2019. Dr. Sarita Tyagi Associate Professor, Indira Gandhi College of Physical Education and Sports Sciences, was the keyspeaker and conducted the workshop on "Health and Wellness". The department also organized a Leg Cricket match for staff members, Athletic events (80 metres race, Long Jump & Shot put) for NSO students, fun races for teachers, students, academic & non-academic staff members. Demonstration in Aerobics, Yoga and Taekwondo were also organized on Sports Day. Around 820 students participated in the events organized by the department in the year 2019. The department organized the 4th Kamala Nehru College Invitations Football tournament for Delhi University Women Football teams.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

The Department of Political Science in collaboration with Gandhi Study Circle observed Martyr's Day on 30th January, 2019. The day began with an Inter-College Poetry Competition. This was followed by a Community Outreach Programme in a blind school. In the afternoon, there was a panel discussion on Gandhi, held around the theme: Gandhi @ 150. The honourable speakers were Prof. Ujjwal Kumar Singh, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi, Delhi, Prof. Hilal Ahmed and Prof. Nishikant Singh from CSDS, Delhi. The Department organized its Annual Department Day, 'POLITIK' 2019 on 15th February 2019 on the theme 'Refugees and Dispossession'. Prof. Nasreen Chowdhory from the Department of Political Science, University of Delhi spoke on 'The idea of Protection: Norms and Practice of Refugee Management in India'. The other speaker for the day was Dr. Éva Rozália Hölzle from Bielefeld University, Germany who spoke on 'Intricate layers of experiencing landless in the North East Bangladesh'. A documentary titled, '4.1 miles' was also shown to the students. There was a stage play 'Ujada ashiyaana' prepared by the students. There was also a picture gallery on the theme of 'Refugees' that was organized in the foyer. There were a series of informal events like the Debate Competition, Poster Making Competition, Poetry Writing and Recitation Competition. The orientation for the students of the first year was held on 24th July, 2019. A talk was held on 21st August, 2019 by the representatives from Amnesty International. India on 'Decoders: A Session on Troll Patrol India'. Mr. Sanam Wazir, Senior Researcher and Campaigner, Amnesty International, India, spoke on the issue. The Department organized a book discussion on 20th September 2019 on the books. 'The Line of Fire' and 'Line on Fire' authored by Prof. Happymon Jacob. The panel

for discussion had Prof. Jayati Srivastava from CIPOD, JNU, Ms. Maya Mirchandani from Ashoka University/ORF and the author of the books himself, Prof. Happymon Jacob from SIS. JNU.

PSYCHOLOGY

The department of Psychology, organized the screening of the film "Anoochcharito" (Bengali: অৰুচারিত, "Unuttered" in English) and a discussion session with its Director, Mr. Sourav Sarkar on 28th of August, 2019. The students were an engaging audience and Mr. Sarkar was happy to answer all of their queries. Childhood protection in the family is one of the most sensible and important topics of concern. Family is the first place where a child learns, which shapes his future. Dysfunctional family distorts the mental health of the child and often has serious health hazards. One should be very careful and responsible about their child's mental health and make sure they create a safe and nurturing environment for the child to learn and grow. "Anoochcharito" is being exhibited/archived at schools of different community development blocks of Government of West Bengal. The discussion of the film is being utilized for conscience building of the higher secondary students of different community development blocks all over the country. The Department Freshers' was organized on 29th August, 2019. This was done for the purpose of making the first year students of the Psychology Department feel welcome to college. It was a funfilled afternoon wherein an orientation was given to the students. Several games and activities were undertaken for the same. The theme was 90s Bollywood. In an interactive session on Human Resource Management with KPMG, Ms. Divya Purang, shared her valuable insights about the scope of psychology in organizations. The session was very helpful, as many of the students, aspire to enter the organization force, but were unaware about the processes and opportunities in this field. The session was very interactive, where students put forward questions and inhibitions regarding the field of HR. Many of the misconceptions and stereotypes regarding this profession were broken. The session was very productive and at the end of the day, they were filled with optimism and a better understanding about the future opportunities and career options for an informed decision in the future. The students of Psychology Department organized a special function on Teachers Day on 5th September, 2019. The dress code for teachers was 'Ravishing Red' and all were dressed up in different shades of red with tremendous grace and formality. On 12th September, 2019 the Psychology Department organized a seminar on 'Community Mental Health' in the New Seminar room. The seminar was headed by Achira Chatteriee who has a lot of experience on the issue of mental health. The talk was a very interactive session between the speaker and the students. She made a great effort in trying to make everyone comfortable and create a safe environment for the students to share their thoughts .A seminar was organized on Women's Health on 26th September, 2019addressed by Dr. Rahul Manchanda, Gynae Endoscopic Surgeon. It was extremely helpful and informative for all the students as they got the opportunity to get immense knowledge about reproductive health, and how to take care of oneself. A Yellow Silent March for Suicide Preventionwas organized on 30th September, 2019 to raise awareness about mental health issues in consonance with WHO's theme of Suicide Prevention. This was done to mobilize efforts in support of mental health issues. On 18th October, 2019 the Psychology Department organized a panel discussion with diverse perspectives on Suicide Prevention. This was in

continuation of the earlier event (i.e., silent march) to raise awareness about mental health issues. The panel discussion was headed by three strong women, Madhu Surya (Educator at Light Up [EMF]), Jigyasa Tandon (Founder of PSY - Fi) and Dr. Nilya Dutt (Counselling Psychologist). A talk was organized on Understanding Eating Disorders on 23rd October, 2019. It was given by Asmita Sharma and Prachi Akhavi. It was an effort to understand Eating Disorders in a socially and culturally relevant manner along with making the conversation accessible.

Awaken: Consumer Club

The aim of the Consumer Club at Kamala Nehru College is to educate the students to act as healthy consumers by making them aware about their rights and redress mechanisms and to act as beacons for the society. We have been working for the enlightenment of consumers who would raise their voice against unfair trade practices and who are empowered to protect themselves and make "consumer sovereignty" a reality. Consumer Club was established on 29th November 2005 and our college is the pioneer in Delhi University for launching it. Consumer Club regularly releases its Annual bulletin, 'Awaken'. The issue brings forth a spectrum of articles, events organized by the club. The club organized various programmes in 2019.

The Club organized a Seminar on "Consumer Rights and Protection Awareness" on 30th August 2019 in the New Seminar Room. The occasion was graced by the Honourable speakers- Dr Jayshreee Gupta, Director, Consumer India and Dr. Sushila, Project Director from National Law University, Delhi. The house in session saw a turnout of about 300 enthusiastic young minds, along with the various faculty members. The seminar aimed at briefing the crowd about the inception of the Consumer Rights and Protection Act of 2019 and further addressing issues associated with consumer exploitation. Dr Sushila took the floor and described the drawbacks of the previous Indian Consumer Law of 1986, the need to revamp it and some salient features of the new act. The bill that received accent on August 2019 intends to "tackle the traditional problems of Indian consumers and the challenges posed by online transactions, multi-level marketing or direct selling" and vanquishing the pre-existing defects like "lack of awareness, expensive remedy, and misleading advertisements and delays in the system". According to Dr Sushila the Bill shall serve the purpose of "providing protection of interest of consumers and for the said purpose, to establish authorities for timely and effective administration and settlement of consumer disputes." Terms like Product Liability, Central Consumer Protection Authority, means to legal aid and rights of consumers were discussed in great detail. Dr Sushila also mentioned the principal initiatives taken by NLU Delhi itself towards the path of creating a safer and more informed society for consumers through practices like court visits, intervention complains, awareness rallies, consumer surveys, seminars, and frequent publications.

What followed was a very interactive discussion between the students and Dr Jayshree about past and personal consumer scandals. She answered all the queries of the audience members by giving her expert opinion on the subject matter and provided deeper personal insights. It was indeed a wholesome and a productive session as great enthusiasm and participation was witnessed pouring out of the students from all corners of the room. The lively session came to an end as the guests were each presented with a sapling as a token of appreciation for their benign presence at the seminar and for enlightening our students. They were thanked for sharing their wisdom in the successful session gone by.

Various students of Consumer Club, Kamala Nehru College participated in the meme making competition collocated by Satark- the Consumer Club of PGDAV College, Delhi University on 5thOctober 2019. Ritika Chhatwal of our college won the meme making competition. On 25th September 2019 Awaken- The Consumer Club of Kamala Nehru College organised an inter-college Poster Making Competition on the topic: 'Misleading Advertisement and Digital Consumers', aimed to highlight the ever growing fraudulent culture witnessed in the marketing industry that takes the help of tools like unproven facts, stereotypes, and corrupt

information to often misguide the buyers, sets ugly beauty standards and the illusion of perfect body that the teenagers desperately seek to achieve.

On 5th November 2019, a multi competition event COMQUEER was organised by the College of Vocational Studies, Sarita Vihar, that saw the coming of numerous young and enthusiastic teams from various prestigious colleges of the Delhi University. Our college participated in two events: Kapitalista and Pitcher pirates. Our college bagged the fourth position. With the hope of creating a more informed society of young and passionate individuals, the students at NLU Delhi organised a free legal help camp for the District Public Park, Dwarka. Dr SheetalKapoor, the teacher convenor for Awaken, along with members of our society, graced the occasion as one of the opening speakers for the day. Awaken started an online quiz competitions for testing the inquisitive minds, Look at the Ad.

Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi became the proud partner of The Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation Consumer Campaign, run by the celebrated Children Rights activist and the Nobel Peace Prize recipient Shri Kailash Satyarthi who is also the founder of multiple social activist organizations, including Bachpan Bachao Andolan, Global March Against Child Labour, Global Campaign for Education, Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation, and the Good Weave International. The collaboration will enable us to be one step closer to the process of creating a global platform for prevention of exploitation and violence against children at the grassroots. We aim to engage with children, stakeholders in communities for creating a children friendly environment. Through our campaigns we aim to mobilise and inspire diverse groups to free children from exploitation and slavery. The institution will strive to strengthen the generation and the use of research driven evidence for creating a child friendly world.

Crossfire: The English Debating Society

The year 2019 began with an Asian Parliamentary debating tournament organised by Delhi College of Arts and Commerce, wherein a team comprising of Vaishnavi Bhaskar, Damini Mehta and Heba Rahman made it to quarter-finals and, Vanshika Singh and Khushi Rajput bagged the fourth and fifth best adjudicator prizes, respectively. The

year 2019 ended in a positive note for Glitz with a commitment for envisioning towards a healthy balance of learning and achieving great heights.

GREEN BEANS: THE ENVIRONMENT SOCIETY

The annual event of the society, Terra '19, was organised on 27th March 2019. The theme of the fest was 'Celebrating the Connect'. The formal session began with a presentation by Dr. Priyanka Kulshreshtha on Extended Producers' Responsibility (EPR). Dr. Priyanka is presently working as Head, Research and Communication, Indian Pollution Control Association (IPCA). Her talk gave useful insights on the theme waste management. This was followed by a talk by Ms. Jyoti Raghavan from India, Green and Wild Initiative. She introduced the audience to the campaign that began after the death of a tigress called "Avni" in the forests of Yavatmal in Maharashtra. What started as a simple Facebook post, has turned into one of the biggest campaigns on deforestation and wildlife conservation. She talked about the need of designing development plans without compromising on the forest cover and our green heritage. Several competitions that were organised included Debator's Retreat- the debate, Slam Poetry Competition and Brain Chop, the quiz competition. As a part of Terra'19, an online photography competition was also organised. All the events witnessed good participation from different colleges. A play on the theme "Celebrating the Connect" was presented by the society members to depict the changing human attitude towards environment that damaged nature. The play was followed by a small cultural program and distribution of prizes/certificates.

In the month of July, with the beginning of new academic session, the registrations were rolled out. A good number of applications were received from environmental enthusiasts to work for the society. Of the 93 applicants, 60 students were finally admitted to the society. On 20th August 2019, an Orientation Programme was conducted for the new members of the society. The teacher conveners as well as the student core team members acquainted the students with the activities conducted last year as well as the activities planned for the year ahead.

This year, students proposed a novel idea of a weekly Group Discussion series on a host of environmental issues. The first group discussion was conducted on 28th August 2019 on the Great Pacific garbage patch, which is actually "two enormous masses of ever-flowing garbage". The issue was first explained by the co-convener of the society, Ms. Taveri Rajkhowa. Later, the topic was left open for discussion. The main issues discussed were: How did it become a problem, How can it be solved, and its consequences on environment and human life.

On 8th September, members participated in the UN dialogue with Deputy Secretary General Amina J. Mohammed on Sustainable Development Agenda and the need for Climate Action. The event began with Anshul Tewari, the founder of Youth Ki Awaaz speaking on the need to take multiple steps and to create a path not just for ourselves, but for our communities. Only if we follow the maxim of "Think Globally, Act Locally", a change can be brought across the World. The Deputy Secretary General took this opportunity to interact with the youth of Delhi on approaches to minimize the impact of climate change. She further spoke on the need of inspiring a new age of leaders and change makers. India, with its youthful population, would be a leader for this long-drawn war for humanity.

In the series of group discussions, the second discussion was held on 18 September 2019. The agenda focused on Unconventional Water Treatment Methods. The participants shared their

experiences of water and traditional treatment methods used in their villages and rural areas they visited. The brainstorming session observed ideas and small steps to ensure that water is not polluted at home and in our surroundings in general. Members agreed how going back to our roots is the ultimate way to be in symphony with nature.

The Creative Team updated the society's board on the theme of 'Amazon Wild Fires'. This was set in the background of disastrous fires which burnt the 'Lungs of the World' in the month of August. Amidst the international attention the issue got, the board brought to the forefront the reasons of fire, its implication on ecosystem and the steps to mitigate such disasters in the future, at the national as well as international level.

In the month of September, this session's core project involving individual's Water Footprint Calculation using random sampling technique was undertaken. The society members were divided into 8 teams, each headed by a group leader. The questionnaire adopted for this was simple and dealt with one's day to day activities. A sample of 800 students was taken. The society built behavioral interventions and awareness programmes at the college level, which would be completely data driven using the data mined from the surveys. Enthusiastic participation of the students ensured that the process of data collection was completed within a month. After this, the unique water footprint was calculated using the calculator developed by the researchers at UNESCO-IHE.

Moving out of our comfort zone, our Society members participated in the Global Climate Strike on 20th September'2019. Fridays for Future, Delhi had organised this strike-cummarch from Lodhi Garden Gate no. 1 to the Ministry of Environment. The students protested against the indifference of the governments around the world on the issue of climate change.

To contribute to the cause of stopping single use plastics, the Green Beans Society started a social media campaign in October on 'Ditching Single Use Plastics'. The society generated awareness about these silent killers through social media and other platforms. Poetry, meme and articles were composed by society members to express their views on the topic.

Another group discussion was organised on 23rd October in collaboration with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Council of Global Youth, KNC Chapter. The discussion concentrated on the Goal 7 of the Sustainable Development Goals-"to ensure access to affordable and clean energy for all". A brief presentation on the theme was followed by an interactive session. Deliberations on the role of government and administration, the common masses in handling this sensitive issue were conducted. The discussion also highlighted the technological and infrastructural impediments in accessing clean energy by the developing world. The diplomacy, politics and economics behind clean energy was discussed thoroughly.

On 1st November 2019, the college's composting plant was inaugurated and a short training programme for the students and canteen staff was conducted by Sh. TRN Rao, who has been associated with Swarn Vasudha, an organization working on composting at home feasible for more than five years now. Sh. TRN Rao is a civil engineer by training and a passionate environmentalist. During the workshop, he demonstrated the process of composting using the biodegradable waste from the college canteen.

An awareness workshop on River Yamuna was organised by the Department of Environment, Government of Delhi NCT on 6th November 2019 at the Delhi Secretariat. Two members of the society, Manali Shandilya and Disha Dubey, both from 1st year participated in the workshop along with Dr. Akanksha. The aim of the workshop was to bring awareness

amongst school and college students regarding the heavily polluted River Yamuna. Dr. Sanjeev Agrawal began the workshop by putting forward the facts about the River Yamuna as well as basic terms related to watershed development and wetlands. Following this, Ms. Jyoti from the FORCE delivered a lecture on the cultural and economic significance of the River and its rejuvenation. Mr. Vishal Gandhi, scientist at the Central Pollution Control Board revealed some unknown facts about the river. He also brought to our knowledge the ongoing government policies for the rejuvenation of Yamuna. Ms. Nigam Agrawal, Sr. Scientist in the Environment Department, informed the gathering about the environmental concerns of immersion of idols in rivers. She concluded with the guidelines provided by the Honorable National Green Tribunal upon the idol immersion.

GANDHI STUDY CIRCLE

"Gandhi Vandan" the annual event was organized to commemorate Gandhi on 30th January 2019 by way of an Inter-College Poetry Recitation Competition on the theme 'Gandhi in Poetry'. There were 15 participants from 7 different colleges who brought their individual thoughts to the table. There was also an 'Ahimsa Silk Exhibition' put up by NSDTI, Madhya Pradesh.

A community outreach programme was organised in two blind schools of Delhi, where the 26 members students of the Circle along with four teachers interacted with blind students, listening to their thoughts and stories and sharing the same with them. It was an insightful experience for all of us.

With the commencement of the new academic session 2019-20 the society organized an Intra-College event on August 28th, 2019 to bring out the hidden Gandhi in each one of us under the name "GANDHI IN ME". Participated in by 47 Students from different college departments the program highlighted the need of positive thinking and constructive action on the lines of Gandhian values. This was done by a creative activity of providing students with real life situations to which they had to respond through the lens of Gandhi.

Gandhi Utsav is the annual event of the society, and was celebrated on October 1st 2019. As we were celebrating 150 years of Gandhi, the celebrations had to be grand! The first event of the day was a talk on 'GANDHI & SECULARISM' by Prof. Himanshu Roy, a senior fellow at Teen Murti. The activity theme was "WATER". Students ran a social media campaign "SAVE WATER". Gandhi Study Circle had received numerous entries on the social media page from students, professors, men and women from all walks of life sharing their unique ways of saving water.

The society members also took a pledge "Say No to Single Use Plastic." Convener, Dr. Neena Bansal, led the pledge and inspired the students' gathering not to use plastics and paper cups in future and to carry their own personal tumblers and kulhads. The event was then followed by a performance by our very own musical band, The Rumoured Project which was highly appreciated by all. A best out of waste competition, 'Renaissance' was held in the foyer of the college. The participants submitted beautiful and innovative entries within a span of one hour. The next event was Nukkad Natak which was directed and organised in collaboration with the members of Lakshya, the theatre society of the college. The play titled, 'Sukha' threw light upon the subject of Water Scarcity, appreciated and applauded by all with an intense streak of introspection. The event culminated with the traditional game of Snakes and Ladder, played by teachers and students both.

The oath was led by the Programme officer, Ms Namita Paul. The event was organized in collaboration with Nazariya, a queer youth alliance and social justice advocacy group operating in Delhi. There was an open mic session, art exhibition and various stalls.

NSS Volunteers participated in I-Safe, the road safety event at IIT Delhi on 7th September 2019, Saturday and started off by the introduction of all the guests and panel members and presenting plants to them. Mr. Amar Srivastava, the founder and president of IRSC, Solve delivered a speech on the vision and mission of IRSC.

The NSS unit of Kamala Nehru organized an event on 24th September 2019, Tuesday to celebrate 50 years of NSS. We held a series of competitions with themes that made people understand the concept of NSS and the essence of social service. The Slam Poetry competition and the Photography competition emphasized on the Gandhian ideology by making students think deeper about the art of social service and the little acts of social service we witness in our everyday lives. The Poster Making competition tackled the issue of the rise of plastics and the students used their beautiful canvases and strokes to make the world aware of the harmful impact of plastics and its use. To close the session, a speaker session was organized where we were joined by Aditi Nagrath, Learning Manager, Slam Out Loud Organization and Muskaan Kohli, Senior Coordinator, Ladli Foundation. The volunteers were asked to assemble outside the NSS room. Before the commencement of the event, the NSS core council took the attendance of the volunteers present.

National Mission for Clean Ganga was organised on 4th November, 2019 at the Dhyanchand National Stadium by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India. It was conducted to spread awareness about the depleting conditions of river Ganga. NSS KNC was honored to be a part of this enlightening seminar.

The NSS members of Kamala Nehru College organised a workshop on POCSO (Prevention of Children from Sexual Offences) and gender equality organized by Sakshi NGO on 6th November 2019. The aim of the workshop was to make the young citizens of the country understand the responsibility they have and the power they hold to raise awareness and bring change in the society. The NSS volunteers of KNC helped in the organisation work of We the Young's event in IIT Delhi which was held on 9th November 2019.

NUPUR: THE INDIAN CLASSICAL AND FOLK DANCE SOCIETY

Nupur, the Indian Classical and Folk Dance Society is one of the oldest societies of this college. Currently, Nupur consists of 13 members in the folk group and 7 members in the classical group. Over the past years, Nupur has performed a number of folk dance forms of India including Lavani, Chhari, Dandiya, etc. Last year, Nupur, performed Sambalpuri, the folk dance of Orissa. The form was presented keeping in mind a number of factors, most importantly authenticity.

The Society has won a number of awards in folk as well as classical dance in various colleges including Deshbandhu College, Vivekananda College, Maharaja Agrasen College, etc. Nupur, The Indian Dance Society also performed in Delhi Youth Festival held at Connaught Place in 2019 on February 27. The members took part in a number of inter college competitions and got second as well as third position. In the Solo Indian Classical Dance Competition Sneha Shaji of first year performed in colleges like Sri Venkateswara, SGTB Khalsa, Hansraj College, etc., and bagged the second position in two colleges which are Vivekanda College and Mata Sundari College, University of Delhi. PROSPICIO: THE PLACEMENT CELL

Prospicio, the Placement Cell of Kamala Nehru College witnessed another fruitful year. With excellent career guidance sessions, internships and placement drives, we were successful in providing a platform to the ambitious students of our college.

Career guidance sessions - The Placement Cell initiated a new and innovative way to help the students train better for future placements and to guide them in their career options through 'CAREER GUIDANCE SERIES'. We conducted sessions on the topics: Session on Group Discussion and Personal Interview'; Session on Aptitude test; Session on Jobs Vs Higher education conducted by Miss Srividhya from Talerang; on CV /resume building session conducted by Abhijeet Singh from Stepvue; Career counseling session conducted by Mr. Jitin Chawala, Alumna, FMS, Delhi.

Panel discussions -Multiple Sessions were organized to impart knowledge and improve skill set of students. On 30th January 2019, a panel discussion was organized on "Women in Leadership Career and Growth Prospects" in collaboration with Change.org, wherein eminent women leaders, Ms. Sushmita Dev, Member of Parliament, Indian National Congress and Ms Shweta Shalini, Spokesperson, Bharatiya Janata Party discussed the role of women in politics, career opportunities for women in politics and how women shape the future of the country.

Placement/recruitment - The Placement Cell of Kamala Nehru College had a great year 2019-20 with regards to the final placements. A total of 15 companies approached the college for placements (on and off campus included). Various job profiles were offered and it included students from diverse courses. The Cell was successful in placing approximately 35 students and is expecting a rise in this figure for the upcoming session till April '20. Some known companies that have chosen students for various profiles included KPMG and EY from the top four consulting companies and other renowned companies like Wipro and Tresvista. Some other off campus placements included those from FIS Global and ISA Global. Organizations offering fellowships like Teach For India and Gandhi Fellowship also organized their pre -placement talks in the campus. The average salary package for the year was approximately INR 3,50,000 for all profiles, with the highest pay being offered by Tresvista of 6 lakh.

Internships Report: The Internship section of the Placement Cell witnessed a massive success in its first year, with over 30+ companies providing summer and winter internship and live project opportunities for this session. The companies offered these opportunities in varied profiles, enabling our students to enhance their skill sets and providing them with the much needed corporate exposure and experience, in the area of their interest. Over 40 students have been selected for internships provided by the placement cell, with the numbers expected to rise, since some of the companies are yet to complete their selection processes and announce the results thereof. Some of our major recruiters in this session include, the Yes Foundation, Consumers India, Glinks International, Decathlon, Crumples papers, Gobarefoot, Quikkloan, Umeed etc. Most of these opportunities have been accompanied with a good stipend, with Yes Foundation and Decathlon offering the highest stipend of Rs. 10k, followed by Gobarefoot at Rs. 8k.

Government Jobs and Scholarship/Fellowship opportunities: The Placement Cell, introduced a new section named as Government Jobs and Scholarship Opportunities in the year 2019-20. This section focuses on making student aware about various opportunities available in the government sector and scholarship programmes. Placement cell helps students to explore the opportunities available to them other than private sector and also guides them for the preparation of the same. Not only private and govt. jobs but students get to know more on scholarship and fellowship programmes. It has successfully influenced a great number of students by highlighting opportunities in sectors like Judiciary, Indian Forest Services, Delhi Police, SBI, LIC, RBI and many more. The section was successful in getting 10 such

opportunities this year and looks forward to increasing this number to a great extent in the coming years.

Sangeetika: The Indian Music Society

The Sangeetika Auditions took place on 22nd August 2019 at the Music Room for all genres like Classical, Semi-Classical, Light, Folk and Bollywood. The candidates were allowed to sing bollywood songs from a given list posted on our Facebook Page. There were a number of enthusiastic singers who came to give the auditions. After a lot of discussion based on specific parameters a few of the best of the best were selected to become a part of the Sangeetika Family. Sangeetika performed a soulful melody of patriotic songs consisting of Ae Vatan, Hum sab Bhartiya hai, Yeh desh hai mera and Vande Mataram on the occasion of India's 72nd Independence Day after the flag was hoisted by the College principal.

Sangeetika participated in the annual festival of PGDAV College (E) and received the 3rd position while performing their annual classical composition on 13th Feburuary'19. Sangeetika performed at the Indian classical music competition 'Swaranjali' hosted by Indraprastha College for Women on 25th February'19 securing the 1st position. WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CELL

The Women's Development Cell of the College conducted a series of events through the year to sensitise students about issues related to gender. On 16 January 2019, *Safecity*, an organization which

documents sexual harassment and abuse in public places conducted an interactive workshop with our students.
