Dr. Julie Ciancio has published numerous articles, conducted professional development workshops, and teacher training workshops on TESOL around the world. She was a teacher at a bi-national center, university professor, and teacher trainer during the 13 years she lived in Brazil, where she also completed her Master's in Applied Linguistics and Ph.D. in Social Psychology from the University of Brasilia (UnB), during which time she conducted research on the influence of acculturation on second language acquisition. She was a Senior English Language Fellow through the United States State Department in Ahmedabad for two years, during which time she conducted many teacher professional development and curriculum development projects in India. She has been an adjunct faculty member in the California State University College of Education, where she has taught and developed many courses in their MATESOL over the last 10 years. Previously, she managed the TESOL master's program, several TESOL certificate programs, and Intensive TESOL Teacher Training programs for California State University, San Bernardino College of Extended Learning. Currently, she is the Dean of the College of Education and Director of International Development at Westcliff University in Irvine, California, where she oversees the MATESOL, TESOL Certificate, and Bachelor's in **Education programs.**

Over two days of interactive workshops, we will examine the new recommended book for the Delhi University CBCS English Language Teaching course: Teaching English as a Second or Foreign Language by Celce-Murcia, Brinton, and Snow, (Cengage Publication). We will look at the content in the book, pull out the main ideas, and present several practical options for delivering the content to students in an easily understandable manner.
